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Supplier Network

The IT Supplemental Staffing Contract relies on a qualified network of IT staffing suppliers.

Workflow Management System

The web-based requisition tool brings best-of-breed process automation and workflow management to the following activities:

- Creating the requisition
- Engaging the supplier network
- Sourcing/screening candidates
- Interviewing
- Hiring
- Time reporting/approval

Users have real-time access to a centralized system that enables them to communicate all procurement decisions to CAI and its stakeholders.
